DIRECTIONS FOR MIDDLES (K-2)

Supplies Needed:

- print out of city of Jerusalem
- 1 piece of brown construction paper
- black or brown marker
- ruler
- 1 bag popped popcorn
- food coloring: red, blue, and yellow
- disposable cup to mix food coloring in

- glue stick
- squeeze glue OR hot glue gun
- scissors
- gallon zip lock bag
- cookie sheet
- oven

Instructions:

1.Build a wall over the city of Jerusalem (see and print page 8).

2. Pop 1 bag of popcorn. Open bag to let cool.

3. Cut out a piece of brown construction paper to place over city, approximately 11" x 5". Glue it over the city of Jerusalem with glue stick.

4. Using a ruler, draw lines on construction paper to look like bricks.

5. Mix 1/2 cup water with the following food coloring in a disposable cup:

a.3 drops red

b.3 drops blue

c.5 drops yellow

6. Pour cooled popcorn in zip lock bag with food coloring mixture. Pour only a little liquid at a time pausing to shake the bag and mix the food coloring on all the popcorn.

7. Spread out popcorn on baking sheet and bake at 300 degrees F for approximately 20-25 minutes. *Make sure to stir popcorn frequently!!

8. Glue popcorn over brick wall to give your wall texture and make it look like rocks are mixed in the bricks to protect the city of Jerusalem.

Squeeze glue works just fine if you use a lot (be very generous with amount of glue) and allow LOTS of dry time. Hot glue works much better with faster dry time although there are obviously safety concerns with hot glue.

DIRECTIONS FOR BIGS (GRADES 3-5)

Supplies Needed:

- 2 toilet paper rolls
- 1 piece of brown construction paper
- black or brown marker
- ruler
- 1 bag popped popcorn
- food coloring: red, blue, and yellow
- disposable cup to mix food coloring in

- glue stick
- squeeze glue OR hot glue gun
- scissors
- gallon zip lock bag
- cookie sheet
- oven



Instructions:

1.Build a wall over the city of Jerusalem. Use any kind of building toys you have at home such as legos, lincoln logs, modeling clay, etc. to build the city of Jerusalem. *Note: If you do not have any of these supplies you can print the city on page 8.

2. Pop 1 bag of popcorn. Open bag to let cool.

3. Using a ruler, draw lines on construction paper to look like bricks (see picture to right).


4. Glue the toilet paper rolls to the bottom each side of the brown construction paper (see picture to right). *If using glue, this will need to be reinforced with tape for better hold.

5. Mix 1/2 cup water with the following food coloring in a disposable cup:

a.3 drops red b.3 drops blue

c.5 drops yellow

6. Pour cooled popcorn in zip lock bag with food coloring mixture. Pour only a little liquid at a time pausing to shake the bag and mix the food coloring on all the popcorn.

7. Spread out popcorn on baking sheet and bake at 300 degrees F for approximately 20-25 minutes. *Make sure to stir popcorn frequently!!

8. Glue popcorn over brick wall to give your wall texture and make it look like rocks are mixed in the bricks to protect the city of Jerusalem.
