We have reached the unreached and baptized in the name of Jesus. We have seen indigenous leaders take ownership of the Lord's call to seek and save the lost. We watched houses become places of worship where seekers and believers could deepen their faith. God is on the move and the First Colony is fueling the fire.

These past 5 years alone we saw ...

- **3 New Church Plants**
- **134 New Groups Started**
- **2,887 New Baptized Believers**
- **161 girls rescued from Human Trafficking**
- **1,043,000 meals served**

In 2022 we will build three churches as part of the sustainability plan. It is our goal to have local ministry needs sustained entirely by local resources. For each of these churches, it will be a different step in the process. In Nepal, it will be a move from a house church to a community church. In Cucuta, it will be providing the church with land and a building that will sustain them for years to come. In Uganda, it will be adding two more levels to their church to be utilized for leadership training and as an income-generating space.
